1. Chapel

The Sisters of St John of God and St Joseph of the Apparition collaborated to create our hospital.



2. Linking corridor

Our art collection reflects our commitment to harness the benefits of arts in health.



3. Wexford Medical Centre

Named after the Irish town where the Sisters of St John of God were founded.



4. Murdoch Surgicentre

Its opening on our grounds was a significant milestone in our hospital's ambition to become a major health care campus.



5. Murdoch Medical Clinic

The physical integration of Murdoch Medical Centre with our main hospital was a first in Australia.



6. Emergency

The first emergency department in a private hospital in Western Australia.



7. Main hospital entrance

Our impressive entrance sculpture was inspired by the life and work of our patron saint, St John of God.



8. Grounds and lake

A welcoming space for patients and visitors to enjoy, our grounds are also home to a range of wildlife.



9. Volunteer sculpture

Representing our dedicated volunteer community who provide support for patients and caregivers across all areas of our hospital.



10. St Joseph's foundation stone

Closure of St Joseph's Private Hospital in Bicton, and the transfer of its caregivers and services to Murdoch, supported the establishment of our hospital.



11. St John of God statue

Originally located at the front entrance of St John of God Hospital, Rivervale.



12. Murdoch Community Hospice

Providing dedicated palliative care services south of the Swan River.
